By 1898 all those who were disqualified by this section were pardoned. In spite of these two amendments, the negroes in the South did not enjoy that freedom which the whites enjoyed. State after State managed to keep negroes from voting. In one State the whites threatened to kill all negroes who attempted to vote. In other States measures were passed which made it a crime for a negro to walk on the sidewalk used by a white man, or to be in hall or room where whites were. By these and other means the Southern States ignored amendment XIV....
